BOARD OF EDUCATION, SUPERINTENDENT BOBBY DOYLE

Superintendent Bobby Doyle presented to the Commission a new budget for the fiscal year 2020-2021 Hardeman County Board of Education with one (1) change. The 2% raise for the teachers was taken out because the State of Tennessee rejected said request due to the pandemic.

Hon. Johnny Lanier made a motion and Hon. Mike Madden seconded to approve the amended budget for fiscal year 2020-2021 Hardeman County Board of Education.

COUNTY MAYOR – FINANCIAL UPDATE, BUDGET AMENDMENTS, LEGAL UPDATE

Mayor Jimmy Sain presented nine (9) budget amendments to the Commission: (1) County Attorney debit from Fund Balance (39000) and credit to Legal Services (51400-331) in the amount of \$9,905.00 for attorney work on Bill Dance Lake project; (2) Register of Deeds debit from Part-Time (51600-169) and credit to Deputy(ies) (51600-106) in the amount of \$673.81, originally moved too much money from deputies line to cover replacing a full time employee with two (2) part-time employees; (3) County Buildings debit from Fund Balance (39000) and credit to Building Improvements (51800-707) in the amount of \$43,868.63 for work on cattle barn at Fairgrounds; (4) County Clerk's Office debit from Maintenance and Repair Services - Office Equipment (52500-337) and credit to Part-time Personnel (52500-169) in the amount of \$50.00 for the line over budget due to need of extra part-time employee; (5) Other Emergency Management debit from Employee and Dependent Insurance (54490-205) and credit to Dispatchers/Radio Operators (54490-148) in the amount of \$1,410.02 for the line wasn't budgeted for a full year of salaries because it was supposed to be taken over by 911; (6) Ambulance Department debit from Other Capital Outlay (55130-799) in the amount of \$9,330.30 and credit to Overtime Pay (55130-187) in the amount of \$2,899.27, credit to Maintenance and Repair Services - Building (55130-335) in the amount of \$4.43, credit to Drugs and Medical Supplies (55130-413) in the amount of \$227.57, credit to Gasoline (55130-425) in the amount of \$1,122.21, credit to Uniforms (55130-451) in the amount of \$176.82 and credit to Motor Vehicles (55130-718) in the amount of \$4,900.00 for lines over budget: 55130-718 is over because of the purchase of the ambulance; (7) Sanitation Education (Litter Grant) debit from Foreman (55720-141) in the amount of \$7,888.47 and credit to Other Supplies and Materials (55720-499) in the amount of \$4,250.41 and credit to Other Charges (55720-599) in the amount of \$3,638.06 for State approval was granted to move grant money from foreman line to other lines in the budget; (8) Landfill debit from Other Capital Outlay (55754-799) in the amount of \$9,270.50 and credit to Part-time Personnel (55754-169) in the amount of \$2,345.88, credit to Contracts with Private Agencies (55754-312) in the amount of \$6,866.52, credit to Rentals (55754-351) in the amount of \$8.91 and credit to Lubricants (55754-433) in the amount of \$49.19 for lines over budget: 55754-312 is over because we are having to transport our trash out of state; (9) Landfill debit from Fund Balance (39000) and credit to Other Capital Outlay (55754-799) in the amount of \$65,000.00 for requesting money to purchase a new tractor and mower at the landfill.

Hon. John Vickers made a motion and Hon. Mike Madden seconded to approve said budget amendments.
